COURSE DESCRIPTION

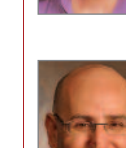

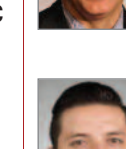

NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Hear failure (HF) is common, but often unrecognized and misdiagnosed. Early diagnosis and effective therapy is important (Circulation 2013;128:e240). There is strong evidence that increased use of evidence based, life sustaining therapies and performance measures have a significant impact on the outcome of patients with HF (BMC CV Disorders 2016;16:195). Recent data continues to show an important gap between published guideline recommendations and practice (Eur J HF 2017;19:301) and demonstrates that life-saving drugs and devices are underutilized (Circulation 2016;133:273, JAMA Cardiol 2017;2561, JACC 2016; 67:1062) and indicates the need for education and incorporation of recent guidelines by clinicians (Circulation 2017;136: e137). The Heart Failure 2020 symposium has been designed to provide an update on new diagnostic and therapeutic modalities as well as new practice guidelines for the management of patients with HF.

TARGET AUDIENCE

This program has been designed to provide cardiologists, internists, primary care physicians, pharmacists, nurses and other healthcare providers with the necessary information to increase knowledge with the goal of improving the care of patients with HF.

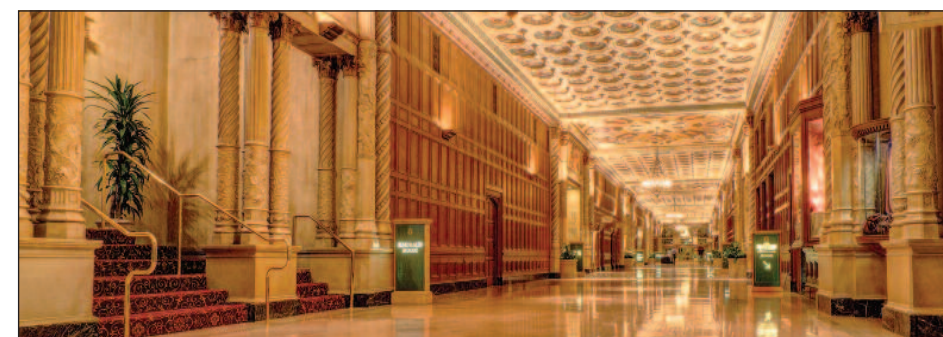
